## Memorandum by Middle-Belt Progressive Movement

We believe that by 1914, when Nigeria came into existence, it came by the fiat of Britain through Lord Lugard, and without consultation with the indigenous people of Nigeria.

- (5) Essential Social Welfare and Human Rights.
- (6) Security Forces.
- (7) Citizenship Definition of Citizenship.
- (8) Priviledges, rights, etc.
- (9) Religion Right of worship.
- (10) Proportional Representation:
  - (a) All the Ethnic Nationalities within the Middle-Belt Region, without exception, are to be represented. Other groups to be represented are: Women's Organisations.
  - (b) Religious Organisatins.

- (c) Organizations of the Handicapped.
- (d) Professional Organisations.
- (e) Private/Business Associations.
- (f) Mass Organisations.
- (g) Youth Organisations.
- (h) Civil Societal Groups.
- (i) Economic Interest Groups.
- (j) Academic Groups.
- (k) Students Organisations, etc.

The past Constitutional National Conference convened by the past military and successive governments since 1979 Constituent Assembly to the 1995 Constitutional Conference had been manipulated, predetermined or, better still, had a "Hidden Agenda" of the Government, and so ended in complete failure. We hope this one will not follow the same way. The 1999 Constitution was a fraud; and no attempt should be made by this committee to allow moneyed bags or the present unprincipled, corrupt and expired politicians to hijack the outcome of the committee. The government should allow the decision of Nigerians to stand.
